ACTIVITY REPORT: PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES FUNDED IN 2023

This document provides details about funding allocated to community agencies, projects, and initiatives through York Region's Community Investment Fund in 2023.

The Community Investment Fund had a critical role in the Region's social services response to the COVID-19 pandemic. During the pandemic period, the Community Investment Fund focused on sector stabilization and helping funded agencies adapt projects and initiatives so that they could continue delivering services safely. As part of pandemic recovery, funding was allocated to community projects that addressed resident mental health concerns made worse during the pandemic period. In May 2023, York Region Council approved new priorities for the Community Investment Fund to guide program activity for this term of Council.

Organizational Development and Capacity Building for Community Agencies is a priority area for the Community Investment Fund program. In 2023, a competitive call for applications process was held to support local not-for-profit organizations and registered charities with funding needs related to the purchase of small capital items, operational expenses, and supports for residents. Through this Community Needs funding opportunity the Community Investment Fund was able to support the capacity of local community agencies to be responsive to local needs by easing cost pressures and/or enhancing services delivery.
