2025/2026 Universal Influenza Immunization Program (UIIP) now accepting applications Update to York Region Pharmacies as of May 9, 2025

The Ministry of Health is now accepting applications for the 2025/2026 Universal Influenza Immunization Program (UIIP).

If your pharmacy would like to participate in the UIIP and safely store, handle, and administer publicly funded influenza vaccines this upcoming season, please complete and submit your application to the Ministry of Health **on or before June 30, 2025**.

Pharmacies that intend to provide COVID-19 vaccines must also submit a UIIP User Agreement and meet all requirements for both programs.

1. Complete and submit an online application form

Pharmacies will need to submit the <u>User Agreement for Pharmacies with a Licensed Injection-Trained Pharmacist</u> (available at the website above).

Note: The User Agreement is an online, paperless process and pharmacies are encouraged to complete their applications electronically before the June 30, 2025, 11:59 p.m. EST deadline. Applications will not be accepted over email. Please follow the instructions on the form.

Your pharmacy must have a valid insurance policy covering the period between September 1, 2025 to August 31, 2026. Additional insurance requirements can be found in the User Agreement.

2. Receipt of a Ministry email confirming application submission

The Ministry will respond within two business days to ALL application form submissions.

3. Cold chain inspection

York Region Public Health (YRPH) will conduct a cold chain inspection at your pharmacy to assess your compliance with the Ministry's vaccine storage and handling requirements which are detailed in the <u>Vaccine Storage and Handling Guidelines</u>.

The cold chain inspection can occur at any time after your application is accepted by the Ministry. Inspections will not be scheduled in advance and are conducted on a drop-in basis during regular business hours.

YRPH will only have **one** opportunity to conduct the required cold chain inspection for each pharmacy, so pharmacies must be well-prepared for the inspection.

You may experience inspection delays due to the high volume of inspections that occur at this time.

4. Approval to participate in the 2025/2026 UIIP

If your pharmacy is approved for receiving the influenza vaccine, you will be notified by email from the Ministry of Health prior to the launch of the 2025/2026 UIIP in the Fall. The 2025/2026 UIIP implementation materials will be available at orange.co.go/influenza in the Fall.

Additional Recommendations

To prepare for your inspection, review and complete the following steps:

- Assess the suitability of your vaccine refrigerator and consider upgrading to a purpose-built (or laboratory grade) refrigeration unit to ensure vaccines are stored safely. Please view this infographic for further details.
- Using a digital max/min thermometer, document refrigerator temperatures (current, maximum, and minimum) twice daily including the date, time, and your initials in the <u>Vaccine Temperature</u> <u>Log Book</u>.

Example:



At least five (5) continuous business days of temperature recordings are required to demonstrate the vaccine refrigerator is working within the acceptable range of +2.0°C to +8.0°C prior to your inspection.

- Ensure a copy of the Vaccine Storage and Handling Guidelines is readily available
- Review your previous year's cold chain inspection report and ensure outstanding issues have been addressed
- Change the batteries of your refrigerator thermometer and cooler thermometer every six months and document the date when the change was made in the <u>Vaccine Temperature Log Book</u>
- Ensure your transport cooler and packing supplies are readily available for use in the event of a cold chain incident. Store ice packs in the freezer and flexible ice blankets in the refrigerator at +2°C to +8°C.
- Cold chain supplies including temperature log books, transport coolers, thermometers, ice
 packs and flexible ice blankets can be obtained free of charge from one of the YRPH office

- Remove all expired flu vaccines from the refrigerator and complete the <u>Non-Reusable Vaccines</u>
 <u>Wastage Form</u>. Drop off expired vaccines along with a completed Non-Reusable Vaccines Form
 at any of the YRPH office locations listed above
- In preparation for respiratory virus season, you and your staff are encouraged to complete the
 <u>Vaccine Storage and Handling e-Learning Module</u> which introduces key information outlined by
 the Ministry of Health's Vaccine Storage and Handling Guidelines such as the importance of
 maintaining the cold chain, vaccine storage and handling best practice, vaccine refrigerator
 organization, temperature monitoring and documentation, cold chain incidents, and tips to
 minimize vaccine wastage.

NOTE: This e-Learning module is geared towards healthcare providers that order vaccines directly from YRPH and content about ordering and picking up vaccines may not be applicable to your practice.
