Who is eligible for free TB medication?

YRPH is reminding health care providers that patients can obtain free TB medication for individuals who have:

- TB infection
- Active disease caused by the mycobacterium TB organism

Please note, that YRPH does not provide free TB medications for infections caused by atypical mycobacteria.
