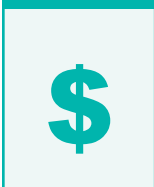

- Have been assessed as eligible (but are not yet on the waitlist)
- Will soon be eligible for long-term care (and waiting for an eligibility assessment or have specific circumstances or conditions that would benefit from services)

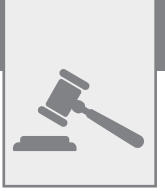
