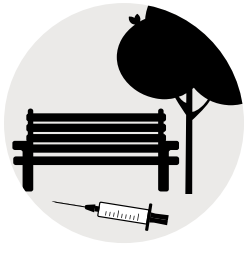


I found a needle. Now what?



On the sidewalk,

On your property:

REMEMBER:

- Treat all needles and drug equipment as contaminated
- Do not try to recap the needle or break the tip off
- Do not flush needles down the toilet or put them in the garbage or recycling
- If a needle, syringe or sharp is found on a commercial property notify the property owner or property manager

EQUIPMENT

- **GLOVES**
(latex, vinyl, garden)
- **TONGS**
- **PLASTIC CONTAINER WITH LID**
or sharps container

Follow these steps below for safe needle/sharps disposal:



Put on gloves to protect yourself from fluid contamination (they won't protect against punctures or cuts).



Bring a "puncture" resistant, sealable container to the site of the needle/sharps and place on a flat surface. Avoid using a glass container as it can break easily.



Pick up the needle/sharps by the middle of the plastic tube with the sharp end facing down, using BBQ tongs or tweezers. If there are multiple needle/sharps, pick them up one at a time.



Place the needle/sharps in the container sharp end first and close the container tightly. Label the container "used sharps".



Remove gloves and wash your hands with warm water and soap or use hand sanitizer.



DO NOT place container in the municipal garbage.

I got poked by a needle. What do I do?

1. Remain calm.
2. Allow the wound to bleed freely.
3. Wash the wound with soap and water.
4. Apply a sterile, waterproof bandage.
5. Seek immediate medical attention by calling your health-care provider or going to the hospital.
